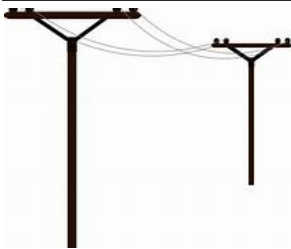

HOOK UP YOUR GENERATOR SAFELY

MYEC knows that some of our members are already prepared for the possibility of outages occurring by having a generator ready to be hooked up at their meter pole. For those who are ready, and for those who are thinking of getting a generator, please always remember — SAFETY FIRST!!

- Generators can be dangerous to linemen working to restore power if they are improperly hooked up.
- Never connect a generator directly to your home's wiring unless your home has been wired for generator use. This can cause back-feeding along power lines and electrocute anyone coming in contact with them, including line workers making repairs.
- Ensure your generator is properly grounded.
- Never overload a generator. A portable generator should only be used when necessary to power essential equipment or appliances.

RETIREMENT OF CAPITAL CREDITS

Your Board of Directors approved a retirement of capital credits to be paid before the end of this year. The years that were retired are 1992-1995. For our active members who were members during any of those four years, you may have noticed on your November bill statement that you received a credit on your account as payment for those retired capital credits—unless you contacted the office ahead of time to say you would prefer a check, as was noted to do on your October bill statement. Budget bill accounts and some larger corporations will be receiving their retired amounts by check in the middle of this month. Inactive-former members will also receive their payment by check.

This is a good time to remind our members that if you do move away from our system, you need to keep your address updated with us so that when future general retirements are processed we have a valid address to send a check to. Be watching in a later issue for a list of members of whom we no longer have an address for, or who may be deceased and we are looking for family members to contact.

Trustee Election Process Begins in December

Many of us don't think about the process of electing our Board of Trustees until we arrive at the annual meeting. But **the procedure actually begins at the December**

board meeting when the trustees appoint members to serve on a nominating committee.

These people then meet to prepare a list of nominees to fill the expired terms. The number of expired terms varies with two trustees completing their terms one year, two trustees the next, and then three trustees the following year.

May members who are not on the nominating committee submit nominations for the trustee positions? Yes, a procedure is provided for such action.

The entire procedure for election of trustees is detailed in the bylaws of the Cooperative. Article IV, Section 3, states: "It shall be the duty of the board of trustees to appoint, not less than 30 days nor more than 120 days before the date of a meeting of the members at which trustees are to be elected, a committee on nominations consisting of not less than five nor more than eleven members who shall be selected from different districts of Mid-Yellowstone Electric's service territory so as to insure equitable representation. No member of the board of trustees may serve on such committee. The committee shall prepare and post at the principal office

of the Cooperative at least 20 days before the meeting a list of nominations for trustees; any 15 or more members acting together may make other nominations by

petition not less than 45 days prior to the meeting and the Secretary shall cause such nominations to be posted at the same place where the list of nominations made by the committee is posted. The Secretary shall be responsible for the mailing with the notice of the meeting or separately, but at least ten days before the date of the meeting, a statement of the number of trustees to be elected and the names and districts of the candidates. Notwithstanding anything contained in this section, failure to comply with any of the provisions of this

The trustee's role in a cooperative is:

- To act as a trustee for the membership's interest in the cooperative.
- To establish policies and procedures for the effective operation of the cooperative.
- To review and approve annual work plans and budgets.
- To receive periodic reports for conformity with the cooperative's objectives, plans and programs.

section shall not affect in any manner whatsoever the validity of any election of trustees."

With these provisions for nomination by petition, the members of Mid-Yellowstone can feel that they really do have a voice in the election of trustees. Plan to attend the MYEC Annual Meeting in March and vote your preference.

The districts which are up for election this year are: District #1 (Town of Hysham); District #3 (Sarpy/Sanders); and District #6 (Hammond).
